Westhampnett Parish Council ('WPC') 14/04/2025 v1

Summary

Q. What's been done to address congestion in Stane Street?

A. Our plan was communicated to WPC, and the details published on the WPC website. All promised actions have taken place, including a company-wide communications campaign and installation of new replacement barrier systems. Initial results were positive, with the 'early starter' bottleneck removed and queuing traffic flowing rather than stationary as previous. We will be carefully monitoring the situation and will work hard to maintain – and build on - this initial improvement.

Q. What has been done to minimise construction traffic driving through the village?

A. Our main contractor is enforcing route rules. This includes a tracker app used for all construction traffic – any vehicles breaking the rules will be 'red carded'.

Q. Why are there still cars being parked on local roads in the area?

A. Our team continue to patrol local streets. Incorrect parking is reported and disciplinary action taken where appropriate.

Q. Will there be a second planter by the Maudlin fences?

A. Yes. WPC will install, and we will contribute £500 as we did for the first planter.

Q. There appears to be construction on the new car park site – have plans changed and the multi-story car park will now be built?

A. These are temporary offices. Our plans remain unchanged and there is no planning application beyond outline for phase 2 of our development.

Q. What additional 'exceptional' working hours are you planning to work?

A. CDC have approved Easter Monday as 'exceptional' working hours. This will allow limited works on the existing site – related to the new site - to be undertaken during our shutdown period. Details have been sent to the WPC and posted on RRMC InfoHub and noticeboards.

Operations

- Traffic Congestion on Stane Street. Advised action has taken place and positive results are being seen with improvement in traffic flow at shift changeover. We will continue to monitor and action as necessary to maintain this improvement.
- Parking on local streets. Our on-street patrols continue, and we will take appropriate action as necessary.
- Planned shutdown. Shutdown runs from Monday 7 April Thursday 17 April for general maintenance, however due to the Easter bank holiday we will return to work on Tuesday 22 April.

- Construction is well under way. It is estimated that the roof will on the building by Q4 2025.

- We are creating an all-surface permissive path alongside the bridleway between FTP416 and FTP417. Works are planned to start WC 11/04/2025 for one week. The current footpaths will not be closed during this time.
- Tree and bush planting are due to start soon. Date and details to be confirmed.
- Limited 'exceptional weekend working outside of construction hours' has been agreed with CDC. Details have been sent to the WPC and posted on RRMC InfoHub and noticeboards, and as below:
