SITE EXTENSION UPDATE

Since the previous newsletter, the new building has continued to take shape. In October, we installed the first major piece of equipment into the building – it will be used for inspection and quality control.

Currently, the building is being dressed in wooden louvres and timber cladding, both in red cedar. This highly sustainable timber gently weathers to a silver-grey colour, meaning the new building will gradually blend into the landscape, just as the existing building does.

We are due to sow the earth bunds that surround the new site soon. Native wildflowers and various grasses have been donated by the Goodwood Estate, as well as one tonne of mycelium-enriched fertiliser that will create a nutrient-dense soil.

WORKING WITH THE COMMUNITY

We take our role in the community seriously at Rolls-Royce. This includes hosting a monthly Community Liaison Forum, allowing Rolls-Royce and the Westhampnett Parish Council to discuss important local matters on a regular basis.

We attend Westhampnett Parish Council meetings quarterly to update members on recent developments and issues. In October, we discussed our continued monitoring of traffic flow on Stane Street and progress on the site extension, including landscaping projects. We have also welcomed various councillors and local volunteers onto the site extension viewing platform to see the progress we have made.

Recently, we hosted the local volunteer group for an evening at the Home of Rolls-Royce to show our appreciation for the work they do in the local community.

ROLLS-ROYCE HOUSE CHARITY

We recently hosted a gala evening at the Home of Rolls-Royce for our 2025 House Charity, Dementia Support at Sage House. More than 120 guests enjoyed an evening of activities, including wine-tasting, a raffle and an auction. The evening was a huge success and raised over £50,000 for the charity. We also announced that Sage House will be our House Charity for a second year, meaning we will continue our support into 2026.



SUSTAINABILITY

To celebrate Rolls-Royce's Sustainability Week, a group of Rolls-Royce Motor Cars colleagues took time to organise litter-picking tours around our site and surrounding roads.

With new litter-picking kits, they gathered several bags of rubbish and ensured everything was disposed of responsibly. It was a simple but meaningful way for our teams to support the local environment and show their continued pride in being part of the community.



SAFETY IN NUMBERS

We funded two new Speed Indicator Devices that have been placed in and around Westhampnett. While they do not have legal enforcement powers, they do log the date, time and speed of each vehicle passing, which can be used to inform planning for police speed checks or road safety infrastructure. This is part of our long-term commitment to improving traffic flows and road safety around the Home of Rolls-Royce.



BETTER ALL ROUND

In October, we opened the new permissive footpath which links Footpaths 416 and 417, for the first time. Councillor Jeremy Hunt joined our Director of Finance, Werner Lulay, for a ceremonial stroll to commemorate the opening of the path.

OTHER NEWS

Additional working hours - We have applied to Chichester District Council for additional working hours for 14 weeks on the extension site. All works will be inside the new building.

Footpath 417 works - We have applied for permission to temporarily close part of Footpath 417 for additional works. The footpath will be re-routed along the Bridleway.

Test Way - We have applied for permission to allow surface testing of finished motor cars on site,

using an existing area of hardstanding. This will result in significantly fewer motor cars being tested on public roads.

Roman Road works - The reprofiling works to the junction of Roman Road/A285 will be undertaken in early 2026. Further details will be communicated in due course.

Christmas Trees - This year, we have provided a pair of Christmas trees that are displayed in Westhampnett.
